## KEY STAGE 2 RETURN TO SCHOOL INFORMATION

We ask parents to drop pupils at the allocated gate and leave promptly, any issues should be reported to class teacher via Class Dojo so we can get all pupils in and settled as quickly as possible.

## USEFUL REMINDERS

### 1. IF PUPILS ARE UNWELL

If your child is unwell then please follow the usual policy for reporting illness and leave a message via the school office and not via Class Dojo.

If your child has any symptoms of Covid-19;

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Get a test to check if they have coronavirus as soon as possible. You, your child and anyone else you live with should stay at home and not have visitors until you get the test result – only leave your home to have the test. Anyone in your support bubble should also stay at home if your child has been in close contact with them since their symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started.

### 2. IF PUPILS BECOME UNWELL WHILST IN SCHOOL

If a pupil becomes unwell with any C-19 symptoms throughout the school day we will move them to a safe place and contact a parent/carer for them to be collected straight away. The staff member dealing with the pupil will need to wear full PPE as a precaution and we have chatted to the pupils about this. Any pupils sent home will not be able to return to school until a C-19 test has been taken. If this is negative they can return when feeling better, if positive they will need to stay home for at least 10 days.

### 3. IF OTHER MEMBERS OF THE HOUSEHOLD ARE TOLD TO SELF ISOLATE

If a household member is told to self-isolate because they have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, that person only should self-isolate. The rest of the household **DO NOT** need to self-isolate unless a member of the household shows symptoms, if this is the case everyone who lives in the household should be tested and self-isolate until results come back.

### 4. IF SOMEONE WITHIN THE SCHOOL TESTS POSITIVE

If anyone within our school tests positive for C-19 then anyone who has been in direct contact with that person will be informed and asked to self-isolate for a period of 10 days. We will of course contact parents through our usual channels of communication.
